Fred Norris 1925-2008

It seems inappropriate to even start this month's newsletter without acknowledging the passing of our chairman and co-founder of UsToo! Brampton. Fred Norris passed away in mid January after he was hospitalized in mid December due to a reoccurrence of the disease that he had dedicated his life to fighting. Unfortunately, in the last year we have also lost Don Grant, another founding member of the group. Through their continuous efforts even up to and including the December Pot Luck Dinner in Fred's case, the cause of Prostate Cancer Awareness has been advanced. The efforts of such dedicated Volunteers, Physicians and Researchers has begun to stem the tide in this battle with measurable improvements noted in the outcome of those diagnosed with this disease. Dietary Prevention, Early Diagnosis and Patient Specific Treatments hold the promise of one day eliminating the sense of loss that we feel at this time. We extend our sympathies to Fred's family and at the same time express our admiration of the man and of a job that was always well done. His legacy will live on.

Dr. Charles Catton - "Post-operative Radiotherapy for Prostate Cancer"

An audience of 65 members, wives and around 10 guests attended this very informative talk by Dr. Charles Catton. Some guests came from as far away as Brighton to attend Dr. Catton's talk, ask question and seek his advice.

Dr. Charles Catton's presentation provided detailed background information on prostate cancer, on Radiotherapy and went on to focus on new research directions and on combining treatments for prostate cancer. The area of combining treatments was not only unique and specialized but included leading edge research findings and some of the latest techniques, providing us with much new information about treatment possibilities previously unknown.

The talk was followed by a Question and Answer session with lots of interesting questions from the audience. Most queries related to member's particular condition with Dr. Catton providing his advice and opinion. A question received by email was also read out and answered in detail. An insert from Fred's 10 Anniversary with the group:

Fred was born in Canada and moved with his parents to England when he was seven years old. My math tells me that would be about 1932. He was evacuated from London when war broke out, and spent his mid teen years in Devonshire. At 17, in the middle of the war, he volunteered for service in the RAF, and became a flight engineer.

He was obliged to put his life on the line many times, flying bombing missions over enemy territory and being shot at by anti aircraft guns and enemy fighter planes. Fred flew these missions in Lancaster bombers. You may have seen these amazing aircraft in the movie "The Dam Busters".

As you can imagine, just getting off the runway in an aircraft loaded with 20,000 plus lbs of high explosives was very hazardous. And he survived 33 such takeoffs and landings while so many of his friends, acquaintances and fellow airmen did not.

How lucky we are. Here ladies and gentlemen, in our midst, is a real live hero in the fight for freedom.

Now... You may or may not know that tonight is the 10th. Anniversary of the first meeting of the Brampton US Too! group.

Your committee decided, on the membership's behalf, to honour the man who has guided this group through its entire life span.

You see, after 33 missions over enemy territory, Fred learned something...he was allowed to live doing a job where many have died, and as a result, he works selflessly to leave the world a bit better off than he found it.
