# Last General Meeting, Tuesday, January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2012

#### "Open Mike" Night

When our speaker unexpectedly cancelled, we were obliged to throw the floor open to members wishing to describe their journeys. We were concerned that the change would result in low attendance, but such was not the case.

Six of our members took the mike to share with the audience of more than 30 members and supporters. All testimonies were heart-felt and interesting. Treatments ranged from the usual surgery, radiation and hormone therapy to more unorthodox regimens. The one thing most had in common was that they were diagnosed as the result of a PSA test. By itself, it is not definitive when it comes to diagnosing Prostate Cancer but it is excellent at detecting advanced cancers and establishing a baseline whereby sudden increases in PSA can trigger the necessary next steps in diagnosis and treatment when and if they are required.

The men who spoke were diagnosed between the ages of 45 and 65 and many had highly aggressive cancers with Gleeson Scores as high as 9. Had these men not been referred to treatment by the PSA test many of these cancers would likely have spread significantly before they were detected. As it is, early treatment has given them a good shot at beating the disease. Our thanks to Dave, Domenic, Glenn, Ewan and Mike for sharing their stories with us on such short notice.

In addition to his own Prostate Cancer story, Jim Dorsey also provided a brief history of his involvement originally with Us Too Brampton and now PCCN Brampton. That history led him to get involved with the Cruisin' For A Cure event first in California and now for the last 5 years here in Canada with our sixth annual event coming next September.

Valuable discussions followed each speaker's presentation.

We are now considering holding an open mike night at least once a year.

## Peel Region Father's Day Walk / Run Meeting, Febuary 11

Last year we ran our first Peel Region Father's Day Walk / Run at Chinguacousy Park. Despite the fact that we did not really know what we were doing, the event attracted around 200 walkers and runners who raised nearly \$20,000 for Prostate Cancer Canada.

We will hold the first of our monthly organizational meetings at the Chinguacousy Park Ski Chalet at 2 p.m. on Saturday, February 11.

The Chalet is located at the southwest corner of Bramalea Road and Central Park Drive. Enter off Central Park Drive. The meeting room is upstairs and there is an elevator.

We have a good core group of volunteers, but all are welcome to attend; there is a lot of work to be done to make 2012 much more successful than last year's walk / run.

Jennifer Gray, *Director, Father's Day Walk / Run* and John Cowling, *Manager, Father's Day Walk / Run* will join us for this first meeting. Both Jennifer and John are experts at running fundraising events. We expect to learn a lot from them on February 11.

Remember that this is one of two major fund-raising events operated by Prostate Cancer Canada every year, the other being Movember. As discussed when we affiliated with PCC last year, all funds raised by our Prostate Cancer Canada Network – Brampton team can be shared 50:50 with Prostate Cancer Canada. # 7<sup>th</sup> Annual PET Sled Ride of Hope, February 18

Many of you have encountered Steve Hutton, our current Webmaster and Steering Committee member. He volunteered shortly before we chose to affiliate with PCC and saved us from some major problems that arose at that time. Steve is in his 40's and he is NOT a Prostate Cancer survivor – hopefully he never will be.

Some of you may not be aware that Steve is also the President of the Prostate Extreme Team (PET). In 2006, Steve organized the first ever snowmobile and ATV events in support of Prostate Cancer in Canada. He came up with the idea after his Dad, AI Hutton was diagnosed with PCa. AI IS a survivor and also a member of our Steering Committee. (AI is nicknamed "Mister 2000" for his initial PSA scores.)

So far Steve and his teams in Ontario, Manitoba and Saskatchewan have raised some \$116,000 for Prostate Cancer. Steve is working with groups in other Provinces to create additional rides. His groups' efforts should be applauded and recognized.

This year, the Ontario Sled Ride of Hope will be held in Gravenhurst over the Family Day long weekend and is certain to be the best ever. As Steve explains in a recent press release, *"For the first time in the Sled Ride of Hope's history we were forced to close registration three weeks prior to our main event.* 

"The astonishing fact about this is that we have had very little snow within 3 hours of Toronto and yet folks are still committed to supporting our cause and have not cancelled their hotel rooms.

*"It seems that our fight against Prostate Cancer is finally gaining steam and for that fact alone I am personally thankful to each and every one of our Supporters & Sponsors!*

<u>The Prostate Cancer Canada website</u> is a good place to start – and perhaps to end up as the site keeps improving. Check out <u>www.prostatecancer.ca</u> and explore the contents of the various tabs across the top, like Prostate Cancer, Research and In the News.

The balance of the Home Page provides various useful links, e.g., to the PCC Network, Shop PCC and the PCC blog.



<u>YouTube.com</u> includes some fascinating video clips relevant to Prostate Cancer. For example, **Paul Henshall** suggests watching a Da Vinci surgical robot peeling a grape at <u>http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=vThf\_sEWndU</u> But be warned: Once you get into You Tube, it suggests related videos. You can easily spend four or five hours wandering through the various clips suggested to you.

**www.yananow.org** is an interesting site operated by Terry Herbert, diagnosed in 1996. Terry chose not to undergo any of the standard treatments available until 11 years after diagnosis. Since there were few sources of information available, he started his own source, using the acronym for You Are Not Alone. The home page features a "Don't Panic" button that leads to …"five initial steps to help you deal with a Prostate Cancer diagnosis." The first step: DON'T PANIC! Terry's slogan is "Prostate men need enlightening, not frightening". His site features testimonials from over 1,000 men describing their own diagnosis and treatment. Highly recommended!
