### Last General Meeting, Monday, May 14, 2012

Dr. Sehdev, "Treatment of Advanced Prostate Cancer"

Dr. Sehdev, courtesy of Janssen, came out to see us as part of a special presentation to review the treatment of advanced Prostate Cancer. When primary treatments ( surgery, radiation ) fail there are a number of forms of secondary treatment that can often control the cancer for many years.

Fortunately, post treatment, the PSA level is an excellent indicator of the effectiveness of the primary treatment. Should this indicate treatment failure there are several options available. In the case of surgery, radiation therapy may be used if the cancer is thought to be localized. Following radiation, surgery is more complicated but there are some specialists that will do it.

When prostate cancer spreads it typically invades the bone and lymph nodes.





Hormone deprivation therapy is usually the next line of treatment should the cancer begin growing again. This can often control the cancer for many years by suppressing the male hormones produced by the Testes and Adrenal glands.

This works quite well for a number of years, but eventually the cancer can become resistant to the treatment. Part of the problem is that the prostate cancer cells themselves can begin to produce testosterone which stimulates cancer growth.

A new drug called Abiraterone, created by Janssen, helps to block this testosterone production by the cancer cells extending the effectiveness of the treatment. Unfortunately this drug is not covered by OHIP as of yet and was only available via clinical trials or a trip out of province. Most other provinces have approved its use so we are hopeful it will become available here in Ontario shortly.

When prostate cancer spreads to the bone it causes irregular growth in the bone. This combined with the hormone deprivation therapy can lead to skeletal events like fractures and broken bones. A new drug called Zometa can help to prevent these skeletal events and improve quality of life. Pain caused by cancer growth in the bone can also be helped by focused radiation therapy which helps control the cancer in area most affected.

Other drugs now being tested work to slow cell division in cancer cells and further control the spread of the cancer. Ongoing studies continue to offer hope for patients but it is up to members of the prostate cancer community to advocate that these drugs be made available for treatment when the results of the clinical studies are as positive as they are for Abiraterone and Zometa.

All relevant factors – including age, general health, ethnic background and family history – must be factored into that decision.
